Public Comment:

- Larry Bourgeois, Worth Township Indicated he lives two miles north of the intake and praised the job that has been done by the KWA and stated how beautiful the building is and how it's a "first class act".
- Matt Kaltz, 4364 Kings Boulevard, North Branch, MI 810-688-2227 Concerned with a crossing culvert being placed on his property. He indicated he has 5 Artesian wells on his farm and that currently he is not out of water, but his wells are no longer free flowing. He would like some kind of guarantee that in the coming years he will not be run out of water. CEO Wright indicated he will call Mr. Kaltz in the morning and schedule a time to meet to discuss all of Mr. Kaltz's concerns.
- Destain Gingell · Concerned with Norway Lake Road between M-24 and Flint River Road. He stated the road was put back at 18-feet, which the LCRC considers to be a public safety hazard too narrow.

Board Comment:

- Tom Svrcek Would like to recoup the \$500,000 subpoena fee for the Attorney General requirements if possible. Appreciates the tour of the Lake Pump Station first class, high quality.
- Laura Sullivan Inquired as to whether or not the pump station has a backup power source. CEO Wright responded that at present there are two different power sources to the Lake Pump Station and are in the process of finalizing a backup generator for the intermediate pump station.

- Jamie Curtis Would like to see all local governments adopt a resolution to forward to the state delegates requesting money for the additional costs incurred to respond to the Attorney General's subpoena.
- Dale Kerbyson Asked Counsel Kevin Kilby to draft a resolution for the municipalities to try to recoup subpoena costs. He inquired about the outcome of discussions with the various fire departments regarding pressure and use of hydrants.
- Joe Suma Also concerned with the fire hydrant usage and inquired if the community will benefit on the fire insurance. He indicated that a woman owning a party store on Kings Mill asked him to advise the Board that her store has barely stayed alive the last two years because of all of the construction. Lapeer County Road Commission also had work near her property in the past which affected her. If she can't get some financial help possibly from the KWA for the inconveniences, she will probably lose the store.
- Eric Mays Gave his cell phone number (810) 922-4860 to the public so residents could reach out to him for any help they may need.
- CEO Wright Responded that a pressure reduction valve would be placed on the area fire trucks at KWA's expense. The people that live in the area should see a decrease in their fire insurance.
